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THEME	the real-world life lesson that a text teaches the reader
INFERENCE	a conclusion that is made by a reader using evidence from a text combined with the reader's background knowledge
RESOLUTION	the way that a conflict or problem is solved in a story
SUMMARY	a retelling of the main events in a text in a shorter version
PLOT	the key events that happen during the story; may include a conflict to be overcome
CHARACTERS	the people or animals who are in the story and are important to the story
SETTING	the location and time in which a story takes place
MAIN IDEA	the most important piece of information that the author wants the reader to understand

SUPPORTING DETAILS	facts or details that support and elaborate on the main idea of a text
CONTEXT CLUES	words and phrases in a text that help the reader determine the meanings of unknown words
CONFLICT	the problem or challenge in the story that must be overcome
1 ST PERSON POINT OF VIEW	this is when the narrator is one of the characters and the story is told from his or her viewpoint
3 RD PERSON POINT OF VIEW	this is when the narrator is not a part of the story
METAPHOR	a figure of speech that compares two unlike things by directly stating that one is the other
SIMILE	a figure of speech that compares two unlike things using like or as
POINT OF VIEW	the perspective from which a story is written

MAIN POINT OR CLAIM	the belief, opinion, or argument that the author of a text is claiming or proving
REASONS	facts, details, or other sources of information that support an author's claim or main point
FIRSTHAND ACCOUNT	a description of an event by someone who was there to see the event or experience it
SECONDHAND ACCOUNT	a description of an event by someone who was not there to see the event
CHRONOLOGICAL ORDER	a text structure that arranges events or steps in order of time of occurrence
COMPARE AND CONTRAST	a text structure that describes the similarities and differences between two or more topics
CAUSE AND EFFECT	a text structure that writes about events and actions and their causes and effects
PROBLEM AND SOLUTION	a type of text structure that writes about a problem and how it can be or is solved
