
Complete the graphic organizer by describing the point of view used in *The Gardener* and how that point of view influences the way the story is told.

- The reader doesn't know what kind of job Lydia's dad got.






1. The story is set during The Great Depression. Describe at least two ways that the setting affects the events in the story.
