



Point of View

Main Idea

Valentine's Day is a busy time for greeting card companies. It is also a hectic time for the postal service, too! In the United States alone, over a billion Valentine's Day cards are exchanged. In fact, more cards are exchanged on Valentine's Day than any other holiday except for one. The February holiday is second only to Christmas for card giving.

Determine the main idea.

What can you infer about Kyle based on the details in the text?

Kyle stared at the misshapen dough. Once again it was a disaster...like a lumpy triangle. Every year, his boss insisted on this gimmick. She'd advertise these "heart-shaped pizzas" for weeks before Valentine's Day. Then she'd be conveniently absent on February 14, leaving Kyle to figure out how to make them.

Making Inferences

Figurative Language

Shanika's eyes were saucers when she looked into her jam-packed Valentine's Day box.

Does the above sentence contain a simile or a metaphor? How do you know?

What is the meaning of the sentence?

What is the author's main point?

Have you ever received a handmade valentine? How did it make you feel? Anyone with a few dollars can buy a store-bought Valentine's Day card. In fact, you can get a box with dozens of cards for a few dollars. However, if a card doesn't make someone feel truly special, what's the point of giving it in the first place? Only handmade cards have the ability to make the receiver feel truly special.

Author's Main Point

Context Clues

Lucy was a very conscientious little girl. She couldn't stand the thought of someone feeling left out on Valentine's Day. She imagined how hurtful it would feel to not get a single valentine, so she made a valentine for every single person in school. That included every student, every teacher, the principal, and even the custodians.

Use context clues to determine the meaning of the underlined word.

EXAMPLE ANSWERS

Main Idea: Valentine's Day is a popular holiday for exchanging greeting cards.

Figurative Language: It contains a metaphor. It means that her eyes were wide in amazement or shock.

Context Clues: thorough, meticulous

Who Am I? Riddle: a Valentine's Day card

Point of View: It is 1st person point of view. The narrator is a teacher on Valentine's Day.

Making Inferences: Kyle works at a pizza shop. He is frustrated and not very successful at creating the heart-shaped pizzas.

Author's Main Point: Handmade Valentine's Day cards are better than store-bought cards.
