
About this Freebic

IMPORTANT GOOGLE SLIDES INFORMATION

- 1. Make sure you're logged in under the Google Account that you want to use the file with, which is most likely your school account.
- 2. Click on the text on the next page to access the files. The webpage will ask you to **make a copy**. By default, Google Drive will save your copy in your main drive, not a folder.
- 3. Each slide contains text boxes for students to type their answers into.
- 4. To assign specific slides from the Google Slides file, make a copy of your master. (You can do this by right-clicking on the file, or while the file is open, going to FILE > MAKE A COPY.)
- 5. Rename your new copy. Delete any pages you don't want to assign.
- 5. If you're using the file with Google Classroom, make sure you make a copy for each student when assigning the file. Otherwise, all of your students will be editing the same copy.

For the next couple decades, many football players wore similar soft leather caps.

In the 1920s, stiffer leather helmets arrived. These still were not required. This lasted until the next big change came in 1939. That year, the Riddell company introduced the first plastic helmet. Unfortunately, plastic was hard to come by during World War II (1939-1945). As a result, plastic helmets took a little while to catch on. By the late 1940s, plastic helmets were here to stay. Even better, Riddell started adding padding inside of the helmets. In addition, the late 1940s is when teams started painting their helmets.


There was still a big safety issue to be addressed. Players' faces were still vulnerable. In 1955, a single bar was added to the padded helmet. It wasn't required at first. However, by the 1960s, all players had facemasks. Most were more complex than the single bar.

Meanwhile, the helmet's brain protection was becoming safer, too. Thick foam padding was added and then other materials. By the mid-1980s, the NFL's helmets were very complex multi-layered protective shells. In 2004, Riddell introduced a helmet that was specifically engineered to decrease concussions. As you can see, safety has come a long way where football helmets are concerned.
