




# DIGITAL ACCESS

- 1. Make sure that you're logged in under the Google Account you want to use the file with, which is most likely your school account.
- 2. Click on the link below to access the digital file. The webpage will ask you to **make a copy**. By default, Google Drive will save your copy in your main drive, not a folder.
- 3. Some of the slides contain text boxes for students to type their answers into or interactive moveable pieces. The students must be in "edit" mode (and not "present" mode).
- 4. To assign students pages from the Google Slides file, make a copy of your master. (You can do this by right-clicking on the file, or while the file is open, go to FILE > MAKE A COPY.)
- 5. Rename your new copy. Delete any pages you don't want to assign.
- 6. If you're using the file with Google Classroom, <u>make sure that you make a copy for each student.</u> Otherwise, all of your students will be editing the same copy.


