

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

What is Groundhog Day?



Every February 2, Groundhog Day is celebrated in Punxsutawney, Pennsylvania. If you look at the date, you'll see it's in the dead of winter. The main purpose of Groundhog Day is to learn how long winter will last. However, the people of Punxsutawney don't ask a meteorologist. They also don't study weather patterns. They don't research scientific texts. They wait for a groundhog to tell them!

The groundhog's name is Punxsutawney Phil. As the tradition goes, if Phil pops out of his burrow and sees his shadow, winter will last another six weeks. No shadow? That means spring will come early. Basically, this weather prediction has to do with whether it's sunny or not on February 2. It's fun to watch this cute, furry animal no matter what kind of day it is. The people in charge of the groundhog wear fancy coats and top hats, and there's a big festival in Punxsutawney. Whatever Phil reveals, people have a good time in this small Pennsylvania town.

The traditions connected to Groundhog Day were brought to the area in the 1800s by German immigrants. February 2 falls halfway between the darkest day of the year and the first day of spring. A group of Europeans called this day Candlemas. If the day was sunny, it was thought that forty more days of winter were coming. Germans adapted this to include the part about animal shadows. Back in Germany, it was mainly badgers. When they moved to Pennsylvania, they used a local critter. That was, of course, the groundhog. The first Groundhog Day festival was celebrated on February 2, 1887. It's been held every February 2 since.

All About Punxsutawney Phil



Every February 2, people turn their attention to Gobbler's Knob, a rural area outside of Punxsutawney, Pennsylvania. Locals and tourists gather, as well as a group wearing coats and top hats. They are the Punxsutawney Groundhog Club Inner Circle. However, they're not the focus. They're only there to manage the star of the show. That star is Punxsutawney Phil.

Punxsutawney Phil is a groundhog. He is also a famous weather predictor. If it's sunny and Phil sees his shadow, winter will be long. If he doesn't, it will be short. Here's how it plays out. A member of the Inner Circle taps on the tiny door of a little wooden house. Phil emerges and looks around. Phil tells the Inner Circle president what he saw. Then, the Inner Circle president tells the world!

According to other weather experts, Phil has only been right a little over 60 percent of the time. However, the Inner Circle says that there's a reason for that. See, Phil is always right. However, sometimes the Inner Circle misinterprets what Phil told them. Of course, Phil speaks a language called Groundhogese, so it makes sense that sometimes there would be confusion.

As the story goes, it's been the same Punxsutawney Phil since the first ceremony. That was on February 2, 1887. Yes, that's incredibly old for a groundhog! They usually only live to around fourteen. Every summer at a local picnic, Phil takes a sip of a special drink. It gives him seven extra years of life. Plus, other than these two events, Phil's life is stress-free. Every once in a while, he'll travel to meet a celebrity like Oprah or the president. Otherwise, he's just relaxing with his wife, Phyllis, at the Punxsutawney Public Library, where he lives.




