


All About Veterans Day

Veterans Day is a holiday honoring the people who have served in the United States Armed Forces. These people are known as veterans. This holiday is different from Memorial Day. Memorial Day specifically honors those who died serving in the US military.

Veterans Day is held every year on November 11. There is a very special reason this date was chosen. November 11 was the day that World War I ended. In fact, the agreement to stop fighting went into effect in the eleventh hour (11 a.m.) of the eleventh day of the eleventh month (November). The agreement was also known as an armistice. A year after World War I ended, US President Woodrow Wilson declared that in the United States, November 11 would be called Armistice Day. Since the war was a world war, many other countries celebrate November 11 as well. Some countries still call it Armistice Day. Others call it Remembrance Day.

Armistice Day became a federal holiday in 1938. In 1954, the name was changed to Veterans Day. By that point there had been two other major wars: World War II and the Korean War. This new name was meant to honor *all* veterans, not just World War I veterans.

Since Veterans Day is a federal holiday, many workers and students have the day off. One popular activity is going to a Veterans Day parade. Many cities and towns have one. Often, local veterans march in these events. There is also a ceremony at Arlington National Cemetery in Virginia. There, the US president makes a speech and lays a special wreath.

The Vietnam Veterans Memorial

The Vietnam Veterans Memorial

Washington, D.C. is full of moving monuments. However, to many visitors, a monument that's tucked away to the side of the Lincoln Memorial might be the most powerful. The Vietnam Veterans Memorial is sometimes known simply as "The Wall." The memorial consists of a pair of long granite walls. They are connected at an angle. Each is about 250 feet long. One points toward the Lincoln Memorial. The other points toward the Washington Monument. Dedicated on Veterans Day in 1982, The Wall is visited by millions of people every year.

The two walls are inscribed with names. They represent over 58,000 servicemen and servicewomen who were killed or went missing during the Vietnam War. The names are listed in order by the date of death or disappearance. The order actually starts in the middle of the memorial with the first casualty in 1959. Then, names fill the first and second wall. They finish back in the middle. So, both the earliest and most recent casualties come together in the center of monument.

The dark stone used for the memorial is reflective, and the names appear lighter than the surrounding stone. When people visit The Wall, they can read the names and also see themselves in The Wall's surface. This was one of many interesting features that architect Maya Lin came up with for the memorial. Her design was picked out of over 1,400 submitted to a national contest. She was only twenty-one at the time. Another feature is that the walkway in front of The Wall descends toward the middle. There, The Wall is highest. Being lower down in front of all those names can have a powerful effect on visitors.


